(As per CBDC and National Commission for Homoeopathy Norms)

Overview of BHMS Programme

The **Bachelor of Homoeopathic Medicine and Surgery (BHMS)** is a professional undergraduate medical degree governed by the **National Commission for Homoeopathy (NCH)** under the Ministry of AYUSH, Government of India. The programme is designed as per the **Competency Based Dynamic Curriculum (CBDC)**, which focuses on developing **clinical competence, professional skills, ethical values, and patient-centred care**.

The curriculum ensures that graduates are trained not only in homoeopathic principles but also in modern medical sciences, public health, and research methodology, enabling them to function effectively in the healthcare system.

Admission to BHMS Course

Eligibility Criteria

Admission to the BHMS programme is granted strictly in accordance with **NCH regulations**:

- The candidate must have passed **10+2 (Senior Secondary)** or equivalent examination from a recognised board.
- **Physics, Chemistry, and Biology/Biotechnology** must be compulsory subjects.
- The candidate must have completed **17 years of age** on or before **31st December** of the year of admission.
- A **valid NEET-UG score** is mandatory for admission.

Admission Procedure

- Admission to BHMS is conducted through **centralised counselling** (All India Quota / State Quota) based on **NEET-UG merit**.
- Seat allotment is done as per:
 - NCH regulations
 - Government reservation policies
 - University and state counselling guidelines

- Only candidates fulfilling the eligibility and merit criteria are admitted.

Duration of the Course

The total duration of the BHMS programme is **5½ years**, comprising:

- **4½ years of academic study**
- **1 year of compulsory rotatory internship**

The internship is mandatory for the award of the BHMS degree and is carried out in the attached teaching hospital under supervision.
